ADOLESCENT OUTREACH PROGRAM

No Cost Telehealth Sessions during COVID-19



Licensed therapists work closely with middle- and high-school counselors to target high-risk youth, identify barriers to success, and through six individual counseling sessions, help them reclaim their power.

SESSIONS INCLUDE:

- SUBSTANCE ABUSE EDUCATION
- DETERMINING INDIVIDUAL GOALS
- LEARNING VALUABLE TECHNIQUES AND NEW WAYS OF THINKING
- EMOTIONAL SUPPORT



Program is offered through schools at no cost to families. Parents/guardians get help for their child without worrying about transportation, money, or time.

Adolescents needing support may be experiencing:

- Difficulties in school/home related to substance use
- Changes in behavior, grades, or friends
- A death of a family member or friend
- Self-harming and/or suicidal behavior
- Depression and/or anxiety
- An eating disorder
- Adjustment to COVID-19/Social Distancing
